
Parade Toilets

Faced with the decision do we lose the Parade toilets or do we take them on from the IW Council, it was a "no brainer" – we had to take them on. After arranging a survey of the building it was decided that immediate action needed to be taken, which included arranging for an architect to draw up a specification for emergency repairs to the roof, ceiling and internal lighting.

Following the tendering process, Emerald Construction (IW) Ltd were contracted for the project, which cost in excess of £63,000. The original roof was removed and replaced, along with a new internal ceiling and lighting system. At the end of the project Emerald Construction also repaired and repainted the Bandstand roofing and benches to generally smarten up the area.

Planning and Licensing Committee

The function of this committee is to inspect planning and licencing applications, advising the appropriate departments of the Isle of Wight Council whether we support an application or oppose them. We can only oppose planning applications following national planning guidance, although we can suggest areas of concern.



Since May the Committee has met seven times during which the Committee has objected to a proposal because of inadequate parking, another was considered out of keeping with the surrounding area, and another for overlooking the neighbouring properties.

Application for a Licence, whether to sell alcohol, play live music or placing of street furniture can only be objected to because of the following:

- The prevention of crime and disorder.
- Public safety.
- The prevention of public nuisance.
- The protection of children from harm.

While most licence applications seem reasonable, late night music is a potential public nuisance. The Committee have opposed applications for street furniture in the High Street, only when the application is to erect tables before 10.00am, as prior to that time the High Street is open to traffic. After 10.00am tables and chairs are welcome additions to the High Street.

The Committee's role is purely advisory, the final decision is made by the Isle of Wight Council.

While other sub-committees make recommendations to be ratified at a full Town Council meeting, the Planning and Licencing Committee has delegated powers to make decisions on behalf of the Town Council. This is because time allowed to comment on applications is quite short, with the potential to miss some in regular monthly Town Council meetings.

National Tree Week 2019

Cowes Town Council became a Woodland Trust Tree Charter House at the Tree Charter Launch in 2017 on the 800th anniversary of the Royal Forest Charter.

National Tree weeks have been going on for many years nationally to raise public awareness and appreciation of trees and their importance for the environment and Cowes Town Council is proud to be part of it.

Sunday 24th November 2019 is the anniversary of that launch and is known as Tree Charter Day and events should be planned for that day and for the rest of the National Tree Week.

On Sunday 24th November, starting at 11am, a tree in Northwood Park will be dressed and it is hoped that as many Tree Wardens and other Town Councillors will help, along with members of the public.

During National Tree Week there will be a guided tour of the notable trees in Northwood Park and an explanation of why the Park is botanically nationally famous. This will be led by ClIr Paul Taylor.

Trees are dressed in any colourful or meaningful way. Coloured rags can be attached to branches. Colourful ribbons can be used. Latex balloons can be tied on. Notices like "I love trees" or "Trees Please/ Please Trees" can be attached, or personal dedications can go on the tree. Please have a think and be inventive. We would love to see you there.

At this time of year acorns are a good topic for young minds because each type of acorn is specific to the type of oak, of which there are 8 or 9 varieties. Free Parking for Mainland NHS Patients

The scheme instigated by the Town Council, for Northwood House Charitable Trust Company Limited to provide four free parking spaces in Northwood House Car Park for Island residents attending NHS mainland hospital appointments re-started from September 2019 for a further six months.



The take-up of the permits for September has been high due to improved publicity undertaken by Northwood House Charitable Trust Company Limited. Proof of appointment is required before a permit can be issued. Thanks to the Town Clerks for administering this vital role.

Cowes Parking 200 for 2020

Please see ideas, suggestions and questions to create and rethink extra capacity to increase car parking for residents, visitors and commuters.

Reconfiguration of existing residents parking zones.

Where residents parking exists, the bays or boxes exceed 4.8 metres (the maximum car length), whereas most vehicles actually measure less (around just over 4 metres). By removing painted bays I estimate the creation of 8-9% extra space within parking zones could be created.



Better use of private off road parking, garages and former car parks.

By offering privately managed spaces (i.e driveways and garages) to commuters, would assist taking commuter spaces off the road. One concern for commuters is the lack of secure parking, which commuters suggest they are prepared to pay for. I would suggest there is considerable scope for householders to come to a private arrangement to use unused off road parking.

There are former car parks on the road to Cowes that could potentially be used for a Park and Ride facility. These are on the main Cowes to Newport bus route, and could offer secure parking for Newport, Cowes and Southampton commuters.

There are also under-utilised car parks in town that remain empty. Could ownership be transferred and used more effectively? Is there scope, when closed premises - schools etc - are better utilised outside normal 'working' hours?

Removal of 'unnecessary' restrictions.

There are areas where yellow lines exist that may not be needed. In the Cowes TRO (traffic regulation order) spaces were found in Crossfield Avenue where buses used to drop off students. Elsewhere potential spaces in Victoria Road and Cliff Road have been found. In addition, there may also be unused disabled bays.

Parking Management Questions and scope for Improvements.

Is existing Long Stay/ Short Stay parking effective?

Is there a requirement for more long stay parking in the centre of Cowes? Are disabled bays fit for purpose and best located to support residents?

Can parking be improved to support businesses and commuters without impacting on visitors and residents?

Your thoughts please.

Egypt Light

Due to the perseverance of former Town Councillor, Elliott Hamilton, the Egypt Light was last restored in 2007.

Following concerns raised by Cowes Heritage of its future as both a Heritage Asset as well as a navigational structure, a meeting took place with Geoff Banks to discuss options to retain the Light.

It was agreed following the meeting, to find out who owns and is responsible for the structure, to undertake a survey of the structure and consider options for its future. It was agreed in the first instance to liaise with Cowes Harbour Commissioners, Trinity House, the IW Council and Cowes Combined Yacht Clubs.

Once jurisdiction is known, a report would be drafted with the potential for future maintenance and retention. In addition, discussion took place about potentially forming a Trust to oversee and agree options.

If you have an interest in Egypt Light, or know of its history, and who may have jurisdiction over the structure, please let me know.

A reminder to all of the Prohibition of Driving Order in the High Street and adjoining roads:



PROHIBITION OF DRIVING

MIDNIGHT TO 7AM AND 10AM TO MIDNIGHT

The following roads are subject to a Prohibition of Driving Traffic Order

which includes all vehicles, including bicycles.

- High Street,
- Shooters Hill,
- · Sun Hill,
- The Cut,
- Cross Street.

The High Street is subject to a One-Way Restriction

Birmingham Road and Carvel Lane have No Entry signs, and this is applicable to all vehicles including bicycles.

All signs displayed are fully compliant with the Regulation and allows the restrictions to be enforced.

The only exceptions to the Prohibition of Driving restriction are listed below -

EXEMPTIONS

- If you are directed to use these streets by the Police or a Police Community Support Officer;
- for the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the said lengths of road;
- any building operation or demolition carried out in said lengths of road;
- loading and unloading in the said lengths of road whilst in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture and effects from one office or dwelling house to another office or dwelling or to such premises from a repository;
- for the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, renewal or removal in or near a length of road specified in the Schedule of any sewer, main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- to gain access to, or egress from, any property in the said lengths of road which have off-street parking which can only be accessed from those roads;
- · by the Fire, Ambulance or Police in any emergency;
- for the purpose of refuse collection from any property or receptacle;
- All mobility scooters are exempt, apart from Class 3 travelling in excess of 4mph.
- If you are caught in breach of this restriction you could receive a fixed penalty of £50.
- CCTV covers these roads and evidence of non-compliance can be submitted to the Police.
