Welcome from the Mayor of Cowes

I was born in 1949 into an army family and spent my childhood travelling to various parts of the world. My family emigrated to Australia in 1966 where I lived and worked for 5 years before coming back to the UK. I first visited Cowes for Cowes Week 1976 and immediately fell in love with the town, realising the massive potential that it had in all aspects, not just yachting.

I finally moved down to Cowes from London in 1981 starting a retail clothing business in the High Street, which I still run to this day. In 1985 I founded 'Project Cowes', an organisation to promote Cowes. This went on to become the Cowes Business Association.

I was Deputy Mayor of Cowes for 2000/2001 when I played a major role in promoting the America's Cup Jubilee, probably the greatest yachting event ever.



I have been both an IW Councillor and a Cowes Town Councillor since 2013, but have now decided to devote all my efforts to Cowes Town Council.

My main aim for the next year in this post-pandemic period is to re-establish Cowes as a major yachting centre; 'The Home of World Yachting', but to also fully support other local ventures such as The IW Literary Festival, Northwood House and The Beckford Centre.

I strongly believe that all residents should be able to fully engage with all activities and events in Cowes.

Coronavirus update

The government will continue to monitor the data and the move to Step 4 will be confirmed one week in advance.



On 5 July 2021, the Prime Minister said he expected the final step would go ahead as planned on 19 July. This will be confirmed on 12 July after a review of the latest data. At the time of going to print, we remain in Step 3.

Planning and Licensing Committee Report

The function of this committee is to inspect planning and licensing applications, advising the appropriate departments of the IW Council whether we support an application or oppose them. We can only oppose planning applications following national planning guidance, although we can suggest areas of concern. If the application is acceptable there is no need for comment. We will sometimes express support for applications which we feel benefits the town; a recent example is Spinlock's plans to develop the former Police Station.

While other committees make recommendations to be ratified at a full Town Council meeting, the Planning and Licensing Committee has delegated powers to make decisions. APPROVED

The Committee's role is purely advisory, the final decision is made by the IW Council.

Projects Committee Report

The Projects Committee is a sub-Committee of Cowes Town Council and is responsible for identifying and managing projects which are designed to improve the amenities within the town.

Current projects being considered include the creation of a new information board commemorating the story of the Ark and the Dove; looking at 'Active Travel' initiatives to improve travel links through the town; installing a World Finger Post to provide photographic opportunities for visitors to promote Cowes; and holding a 'Cowes Fayre' to showcase the produce of our local businesses.

Please contact the Town Clerk if you have a project in Cowes which you would like Councillors to consider.

Summer planting

We have been able to provide seasonal colourful displays in the town planters again this year, which is a great way to keep the town looking bright and welcoming. All plants are supplied and maintained by Care in the Garden and watered by JW Autoshine. The hanging baskets on the Parade and Cowes' entry points are supplied by Forest View Nursery.

Place Plan for Cowes and Northwood

The Place Plan for Cowes and Northwood has been completed. Thank you to all those who took the time to give feedback as part of the consultation undertaken by ARC Consulting. The objective of a place plan is to provide a menu of actions for positive change consistent with the lived experience of local people, the aspirations of local businesses and organizations, and the strategic context provided by local plans and policies. We look forward to working through the content to shape positive change for Cowes and Northwood.

We should preserve their memory

Dear readers,

We are writing to you to draw attention to the need to undertake essential restoration and improvements to an important and poignant part of Cowes' heritage.

In May 2022 the town's attention will be focused on commemoration events which will be held to recount the town's tragic loss of civilian lives which took place on the night of the blitz on 4/5th May 1942. The commemoration will mark the 80th anniversary of that night-time raid which saw the loss of 70 civilians from Cowes and East Cowes.

On both sides of the river Medina most of those casualties were hurriedly buried in communal graves in their respective cemeteries. These communal graves will play an intrinsic part of the commemoration and there is the need for restoration works to be completed in readiness.


Interred in Northwood Cemetery's communal grave are the remains of some twenty-seven people who innocently forfeited their lives that night. The headstone to this communal grave was restored in 2017 and registers the names of those lost.

Although this headstone is a most acceptable epitaph to those interred, the kerb stones of the graves have suffered seriously from ground movement and general settlement. The undulations and lineage are the focus of this restoration work, as is the need for improvements to this grave's visual appearance and to reduce future maintenance.

The Friends of Northwood Cemetery aims to restore this grave to a condition which reflects the sacrifices of that night and to provide us with a respectful memorial in recognition of that loss.

Thus far £8,000 of funds have been secured by 'the Friends' for this restoration work, leaving an estimated £4,000 shortfall and this is where we look to you for your generosity. Any contribution, however small, will be acknowledged and most gratefully received.

We owe it to those families and individuals who, as non-combatants in that conflict, made that ultimate sacrifice. Their loss should be remembered and preserved for future generations to witness, as were those lost in combat.
