June saw the Round the Island race take place and July saw the Biosphere Festival running events in the town and Island-wide. We also received the good news that Cowes Library has reopened!



Cowes Town Council Taking a Lead in Joined Up Thinking

Through the Cowes and Northwood Place Plan one of the essential priorities identified was to write a Local Area Planning Strategy that sat inside the Isle of Wight Plan Core Strategy and also the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) and addressed local issues and other standards and initiatives that are conducive to our needs in addressing health and wellbeing issues and enhancing our prosperity.

An essential standard is PAS 184, the Place Making standard, but also to use the Healthy Streets and Safer Streets initiatives, including the Link and Place model for categorising streets according to their connectivity value and environmental setting, and the Cowes, Gurnard and Northwood LCWIP (Local Cycling, Walking Infrastructure Plan), which is approved and adopted by the Isle of Wight Council.



Other considerations that we would want to include are addressing the health inequalities outlined in Public Health's JSNA (Joint Strategic Needs Assessment), promoting local industry and innovation, particularly our valuable marine industry, but also our high tech industry and service industries, protecting the valuable and essential clear airspace that BAE systems depend on for their business to be in Cowes, enhancing our unique history and heritage.

A Local Area Planning Strategy is a good opportunity to address needs and short-comings in infrastructure that enable and enhance our aspirations in status and development, including more and better hotel accommodation, a conference centre, leisure centre, and encouraging the use of sustainable materials such as natural slate and clay tiles in preference to the synthetic alternatives that degrade so quickly and look ugly as they age.

If you are a local organisation or business with a defibrillator, please let us know the location of it, the times is it accessible and please also ensure it is registered on The Circuit www.TheCircuit.uk so it can be located and deployed in an emergency.

Registering your defibrillator helps improve access and reduce delays to life saving treatment.

Vandalism at our Public Conveniences

We were disappointed to have to report an incident of antisocial behaviour in the Changing Places toilet at The Cut earlier in the year.

Following the incident, we provided CCTV footage to the Police who were able to identify all the youths seen in the footage. Consequently, the Police issued anti-social behaviour warning letters and visited the parents of the young people.

A new CCTV camera has since been installed in the area to cover the entrance to the Changing Places toilet.



These facilities are vital to those who require them so it is important that they are always functioning and accessible.



We had further incidents of vandalism in our facilities during the school holidays, this time at Mornington Road and The Parade and at the toilets in Northwood Park which are managed by Northwood House Charitable Trust Co. Ltd.

It is disappointing to have to use our resources on addressing vandalism in the town. We would rather be spending Town Council resources on bringing forward new projects that bring about improvements to the town.

If you witness anti-social behaviour or vandalism in the town, please do report it to the Police straight away.

Cowes Youth Voice

Councillors are keen to connect with young people in the town to hear their views, so were pleased to support the first 'Cowes Youth Voice' meeting in June. This forum is a wonderful opportunity for the Town Council to receive feedback from young people living in Cowes to find out what the Council can do for them. The Town Council will also be exploring options for feedback from other groups.

On The Parade, local veterans were treated to a tea party on The Bandstand with entertainment from Vectis Corps of Drums and singing duo Double Take. Veterans were served with the official Women's Institute VE Day 2025 Orange and Ginger Cake, made by Cowes WI.

At 9.30pm, Deputy Lord-Lieutenant, Colonel Snagge OBE, lit the beacon of peace on The Parade, before reading the Nation's Tribute. All those present joined in to sing 'I Vow To Thee My Country.'

On VJ Day on Friday 15 August, a short service was led by Rev. Emma Taylor in Northwood Park where the Mayor laid a wreath in remembrance of all those who fought and died in Japan.

Cowes Week 2025

This year, we had a stand on The Parade during Cowes Week so that we could find out what residents want to see in Cowes.

The ideas were written on paper and turned into origami boats which we collected up and are now in the process of reviewing.

Some of the ideas included introducing a pump track, improved public conveniences, a swimming pool, more planting around the town and more things for young people to do.



Our Place Plan Working Group will be reviewing all the ideas at their next meeting.

Projects

New planters

The Town Council is working with the IW Council's Regeneration Officer to install new planters in the High Street to give the area a fresh look and feel. Phase one will see new planters in the wide area of the High Street between Fountain Yard and Sun Hill, enhancing the existing seating and planters.

The Cut

The mural wall has been looking tired for a while now, so we are working on installing a 'Living Wall' which involves cleaning up and painting the wall ready to grow plants in front of it.

We will also be making other improvements to The Cut area by installing new planters, new seating and a rainwater harvesting system to collect water from the roof of the toilet block to drip feed the planters.

Thank you to Care in the Garden for assisting us with the start of the planting.



Town Clock

The town clock, sited at the top of Shooters Hill, provides a useful timepiece for passers-by, while adding to the traditional appearance of the town. The clock is currently not working, and the Town Council is looking at options for repair and refurbishment.



Town Maps

The large Town Map display boards situated between the Floating Bridge and The Parade needed updating; the new maps were fitted in August.



Community Orchard

Our community orchard at Northwood Recreation Ground is doing well. The trees were planted in April 2022 to provide free fruit to residents. They continue to be monitored by our Tree Wardens. They are inspected regularly and watered in dry weather. The young trees are flourishing and this year we have seen some fruit on them. We look forward to watching them continue to grow.
